Objectives of the project

The principal objectives of the project are:

- To examine the fundamental determinants of sovereign ratings and evaluate if they are common across different international rating agencies
- To investigate if the relative importance of fundamental determinants has changed from the pre-economic crisis (upto September 2008) to the post-economic crisis period (after September 2008)
- To analyze the impact of sovereign rating change on default spreads and on stock market performance and exchange rate volatility

This study shall contribute to the international finance literature for both mature and emerging markets. The study will identify focus areas and provide policy suggestions for rating improvement.

Objectives shared with the student

The three rating agencies that we have been scrupulously studying in this project are Moody's, S&P and Fitch. Our student team is involved in data collection and analysis for Moody's and Fitch and review of literature. Pedro is helping us in meticulously analyzing the sovereign rating methodology of S&P, the ratings assigned by it to the different countries, any subsequent changes in these ratings since the original assignment etc. He is also doing a literature review to investigate if the relative importance of fundamental determinants has changed from the pre-economic crisis to the post economic crisis period. We have been regularly guiding him and addressing his queries regarding the work through email and Skype.
